Security-Kenny Light, Chairman

Top 5 accomplishments from the Security Committee over the past two years:

- 1. Installed security cameras on the multipurpose building and the exterior areas of the cabins.
- 2. Installed better locks on the multipurpose and maintenance building doors.
- 3. Installed bars on the windows of the maintenance building.
- 4. Installed 'No Trespassing' signs at the creek near the southwest corner of the property.
- 5. Added security procedures to camp handbook.

Beautification-David Garver, Chairman

- 1) Coordinate with the Maintenance Committee on camp improvements and modifications to maintain aesthetics.
- 2) Coordinate with Facilities Managers for ease of mowing, perimeter management and ease of watering during the season.
- 3) To date over 1500 daffodils have been planted across the campgrounds for Spring beauty with approximately 500 scheduled to be planted each Fall.
- 4) Strategically design the landscaping of camp for three-season color with blooms present from March to October.
- 5) Order plants/bulbs in Fall and work with volunteers to magnify the beauty of camp.
- 6) Coordinate with Missourians for Monarchs, MonarchWatch, Missouri Prairie Foundation and other organizations to support Butterfly repopulation efforts and the story of "Christian transformation" that the Monarch signifies in our camp logo.
- 7) Properly maintain the main camp entrance and the plants, flowers and trees that provide the first impression of camp to donors, members and campers and their families.
- 8) Reflect the true beauty of God's creation in as many areas of camp as possible.

We want to invite everyone to come to our **spring workday on May 6th**. We need carpenters, laborers, workers for landscaping, painters, lumberjacks, and workers to clean the kitchen and cabins. Lunch will be provided.

Marketing-Andrew White, Chairman


