



Upcoming Projects for Site Maintenance

The site maintenance committee is currently evaluating several improvement projects in preparation for the 2026 camp sessions. Our initial focus is the replacement of the roof on the Multi. This upgrade will address existing leaks and enable subsequent enhancements to the Multi, dining hall, and kitchen facilities. It is our goal to ensure that this building remains functional and reliable for many years.

The committee is also assessing necessary repairs and improvements to the lagoon. Restoring this area will position the camp for future development and

support ongoing facility upgrades.

In addition, we are considering expansion of the chapel to accommodate larger groups. An extended roof structure would provide increased shade and protection from inclement weather, thereby improving the overall experience for all campers.

We also anticipate making several smaller improvements to the kitchen, dining hall, and various areas throughout the camp. We respectfully request your prayers as we strive to function as responsible and faithful stewards of the camp and its resources.

Tis the Season


